Southern Tier Enterprise Development Organization (STEDO) offers financing for area businesses

Southern Tier Enterprise Development Organization (STEDO) is an affiliate of Southern Tier West (STW) that provides small business owners and entrepreneurs with access to capital through low-interest public sector loan funds featuring flexible conditions and terms. STEDO funds are derived from loans or grants from US Department of Agriculture and Rural Economic Development, US Department of Commerce and Economic Development Administration, Appalachian Regional Commission, and New York State; and are available to small business owners in Allegany, Cattaraugus, and Chautauqua Counties.

STEDO loans supplement commercial loans to provide affordable and flexible gap financing to assist small business owners in assembling the needed capital to achieve their goals. All types of businesses are eligible to submit an application, including but not limited to industrial, wholesale, retail, and service. Eligible activities for STEDO loans include, fixed asset acquisition, land

05/21/13 Informational Seminar for Businesses costs associated with acquisition and preparation, building costs from engineering and architectural to legal, machinery and equipment costs, working capital, and guarantee bank loans. Activities not eligible for STEDO loans include speculative activities, relocation of jobs from one labor area to another, investment, purchasing finance equity in a private business, and loans that create a potential conflict of interest.

STEDO works with clients to develop terms and repayment schedules that will allow the client the necessary cash flow at vital milestones in their business plan and growth expectations. Loans range from \$10,000 to \$150,000. Repayment length of time depends on the use of proceeds; usually 5-7 years for working capital and up to 20 years for fixed assets. The application fee is \$200 with a \$100 refund upon approval and closing of your loan. The borrower should create and/or retain a minimum of one job for every \$5,000 of STEDO monies borrowed. Sufficient assets must be pledged by borrowers to adequately secure the loan. Personal guaranties and key person life insurance are required from all owners having 20% or more ownership in the business. Liens on personal assets of the principals may also be required.

Annual performance report on New York's IDA's - Fiscal year ending 2011

On Tuesday afternoon, New York State Comptroller Mr. Thomas DiNapoli released OSC's **Annual Report** on IDA's. The Report is for project activity during year 2011. The released audit report shows that in 2011, the 113 active IDA's located throughout New York State supported 4,486 projects and provided total tax exemptions of nearly \$1.5 billion. These tax exemptions were partially offset by PILOT's of \$917 million made by the sponsored projects, for a **total** net exemptions of \$560 million.

IDA projects reported a total of 701,169 full-time equivalent positions, which reflects an increase of 217,587 jobs from the commencement of the projects. The average cost per job created was \$2,575, which demonstrates a highly cost-effective and efficient economic development program.

I think it is important to highlight a few of these figures above. Considering the State average to create a job is \$ 2,575, our "average cost" was \$1,338, which is a number we will look to continue to drive down even further. In addition, our operating budget for the entire year is only \$206,744, equating to an expense per job gained at \$243! This notes our IDA's efficiencies with utilizing an austere budget to deliver economic development at a very low cost to our Agency and County. It is our goal and mission to balance public revenue that offsets private sector development and cost. The CCIDA Board does not take that lightly.

Please note that the CCIDA Board and Staff will continue to looks for ways to better improve our programs and processes to continue to help grow our economy here in Cattaraugus County.
