

NOTE. HOUSEHOLDS AND FAMILIES: In 2005-2009 there were 530 households in Delevan village. The average household size was 2.3 people.

Families made up 58 percent of the households in Delevan village. This figure includes both married-couple families (36 percent) and other families (21 percent). Nonfamily households made up 42 percent of all households in Delevan village. Most of the nonfamily households were people living alone, but some were composed of people living in households in which no one was related to the householder.

NATIVITY AND LANGUAGE: Less than 0.5 percent of the people living in Delevan village in 2005-2009 were foreign born. One hundred percent was native, including 86 percent who were born in New York.

Among people at least five years old living in Delevan village in 2005-2009, 2 percent spoke a language other than English at home. Of those speaking a language other than English at home, 33 percent spoke Spanish and 67 percent spoke some other language; 21 percent reported that they did not speak English "very well."

GEOGRAPHIC MOBILITY: In 2005-2009, 81 percent of the people at least one year old living in Delevan village were living in the same residence one year earlier; 14 percent had moved during the past year from another residence in the same county, 4 percent from another county in the same state, 1 percent from another state, and less than 0.5 percent from abroad.

Geographic Mobility of Residents of Delevan village, New York in 2005-2009



EDUCATION: In 2005-2009, 82 percent of people 25 years and over had at least graduated from high school and 8 percent had a bachelor's degree or higher. Eighteen percent were dropouts; they were not enrolled in school and had not graduated from high school.

The total school enrollment in Delevan village was 310 in 2005-2009. Nursery school and kindergarten enrollment was 36 and elementary or high school enrollment was 210 children. College or graduate school enrollment was 62.




The Educational Attainment of People in Delevan village, New York in 2005-2009


DISABILITY: In Delevan village, among people at least five years old in 2005-2009, percent reported a disability. The likelihood of having a disability varied by age - from percent of people 5 to 15 years old, to percent of people 16 to 64 years old, and to percent of those 65 and older.

INDUSTRIES: In 2005-2009, for the employed population 16 years and older, the leading industries in Delevan village were Educational services, and health care, and social assistance, 22 percent, and Manufacturing, 22 percent.

Employment by Industry in Delevan village, New York in 2005-2009









OCCUPATIONS AND TYPE OF EMPLOYER: Among the most common occupations were: Service occupations, 24 percent; Sales and office occupations, 24 percent; Production, transportation, and material moving occupations, 22 percent; Management, professional, and related occupations, 16 percent; and Construction, extraction, maintenance, and repair occupations, 11 percent. Seventy-nine percent of the people employed were Private wage and salary workers; 14 percent was Federal, state, or local government workers; and 8 percent was Self-employed in own not incorporated business workers.

TRAVEL TO WORK: Seventy-six percent of Delevan village workers drove to work alone in 2005-2009, 16 percent carpooled, 1 percent took public transportation, and 4 percent used other means. The remaining 3 percent worked at home. Among those who commuted to work, it took them on average 22.8 minutes to get to work.

INCOME: The median income of households in Delevan village was \$37,250. Seventy-five percent of the households received earnings and 14 percent received retirement income other than Social Security. Thirty-one percent of the households received Social Security. The average income from Social Security was \$13,824. These income sources are not mutually exclusive; that is, some households received income from more than one source.

POVERTY AND PARTICIPATION IN GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS: In 2005-2009, 24 percent of people were in poverty. Thirty-seven percent of related children under 18 were below the poverty level, compared with 5 percent of people 65 years old and over. Twenty percent of all families and 50 percent of families with a female householder and no husband present had incomes below the poverty level.




Poverty Rates in Delevan village, New York in 2005-2009

POPULATION OF Delevan village: In 2005-2009, Delevan village had a total population of 1,200 - 610 (50 percent) females and 600 (50 percent) males. The median age was 33.1 years. Twenty-seven percent of the population was under 18 years and 11 percent was 65 years and older.


The Age Distribution of People in Delevan village, New York in 2005-2009

For people reporting one race alone, 100 percent was White; less than 0.5 percent was Black or African American; less than 0.5 percent was American Indian and Alaska Native; less than 0.5 percent was Asian; less than 0.5 percent was Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, and less than 0.5 percent was Some other race. Less than 0.5 percent reported Two or more races. Less than 0.5 percent of the people in Delevan village was Hispanic. One hundred percent of the people in Delevan village was White non-Hispanic. People of Hispanic origin may be of any race.

HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS: In 2005-2009, Delevan village had a total of 550 housing units, 4 percent of which were vacant. Of the total housing units, 53 percent was in single-unit structures, 42 percent was in multi-unit structures, and 5 percent was mobile homes. Twenty percent of the housing units were built since 1990.



The Types of Housing Units in Delevan village, New York in 2005-2009



OCCUPIED HOUSING UNIT CHARACTERISTICS: In 2005-2009, Delevan village had 530 occupied housing units - 260 (48 percent) owner occupied and 270 (52 percent) renter occupied. Five percent of the households did not have telephone service and 13 percent of the households did not have access to a car, truck, or van for private use. Thirty-six percent had two vehicles and another 9 percent had three or more.

HOUSING COSTS: The median monthly housing costs for mortgaged owners was \$1,089, nonmortgaged owners \$435, and renters \$464. Thirty-six percent of owners with mortgages, 11 percent of owners without mortgages, and 44 percent of renters in Delevan village spent 30 percent or more of household income on housing.
