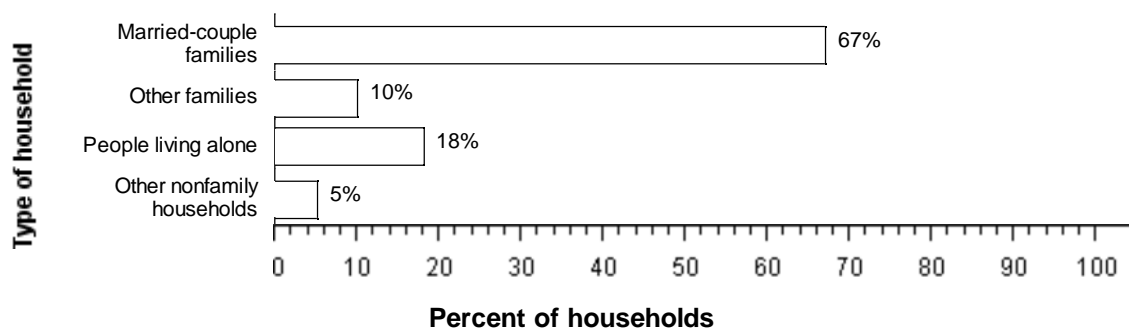

**HOUSEHOLDS AND FAMILIES:** In 2005-2009 there were 200 households in East Randolph village. The average household size was 2.5 people.

Families made up 77 percent of the households in East Randolph village. This figure includes both married-couple families (67 percent) and other families (10 percent). Nonfamily households made up 23 percent of all households in East Randolph village. Most of the nonfamily households were people living alone, but some were composed of people living in households in which no one was related to the householder.

**The Types of Households in East Randolph village, New York in 2005-2009**



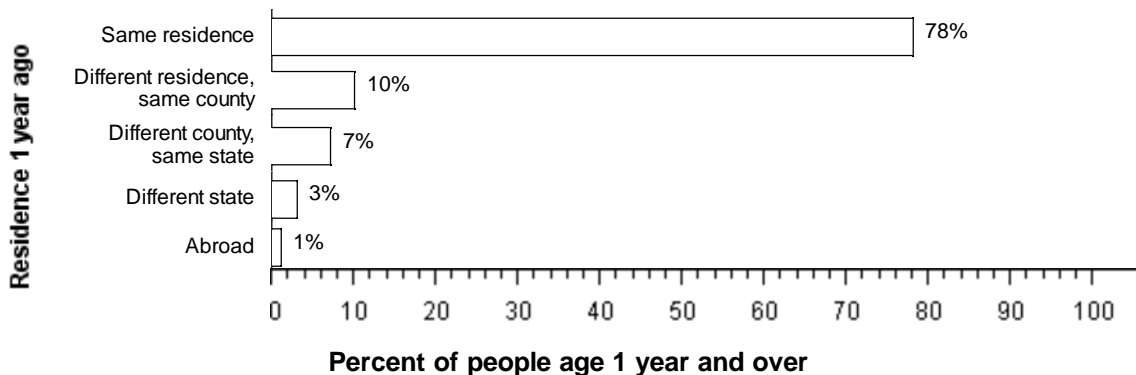

**NATIVITY AND LANGUAGE:** Less than 0.5 percent of the people living in East Randolph village in 2005-2009 were foreign born. One hundred percent was native, including 83 percent who were born in New York.

Among people at least five years old living in East Randolph village in 2005-2009, 6 percent spoke a language other than English at home. Of those speaking a language other than English at home, 22 percent spoke Spanish and 78 percent spoke some other language; 6 percent reported that they did not speak English "very well."

**GEOGRAPHIC MOBILITY:** In 2005-2009, 78 percent of the people at least one year old living in East Randolph village were living in the same residence one year earlier; 10 percent had moved during the past year from another residence in the same county, 7 percent from another county in the same state, 3 percent from another state, and 1 percent from abroad.

### **Geographic Mobility of Residents of East Randolph village, New York in 2005-2009**

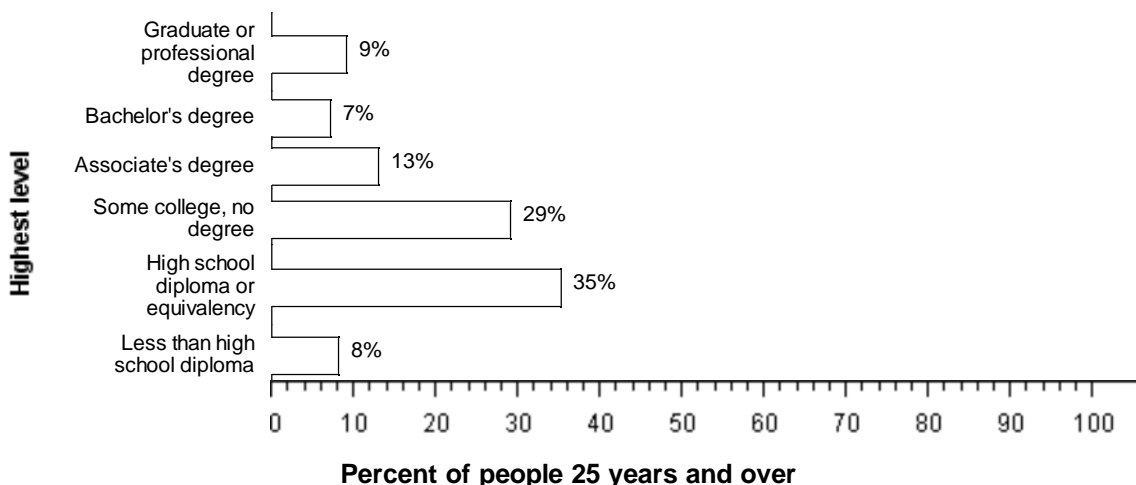

**EDUCATION:** In 2005-2009, 92 percent of people 25 years and over had at least graduated from high school and 16 percent had a bachelor's degree or higher. Eight percent were dropouts; they were not enrolled in school and had not graduated from high school.

The total school enrollment in East Randolph village was 190 in 2005-2009. Nursery school and kindergarten enrollment was 24 and elementary or high school enrollment was 140 children. College or graduate school enrollment was 33.

**The Educational Attainment of People in East Randolph village, New York in 2005-2009**

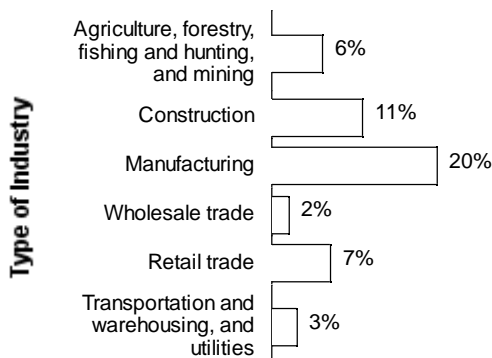


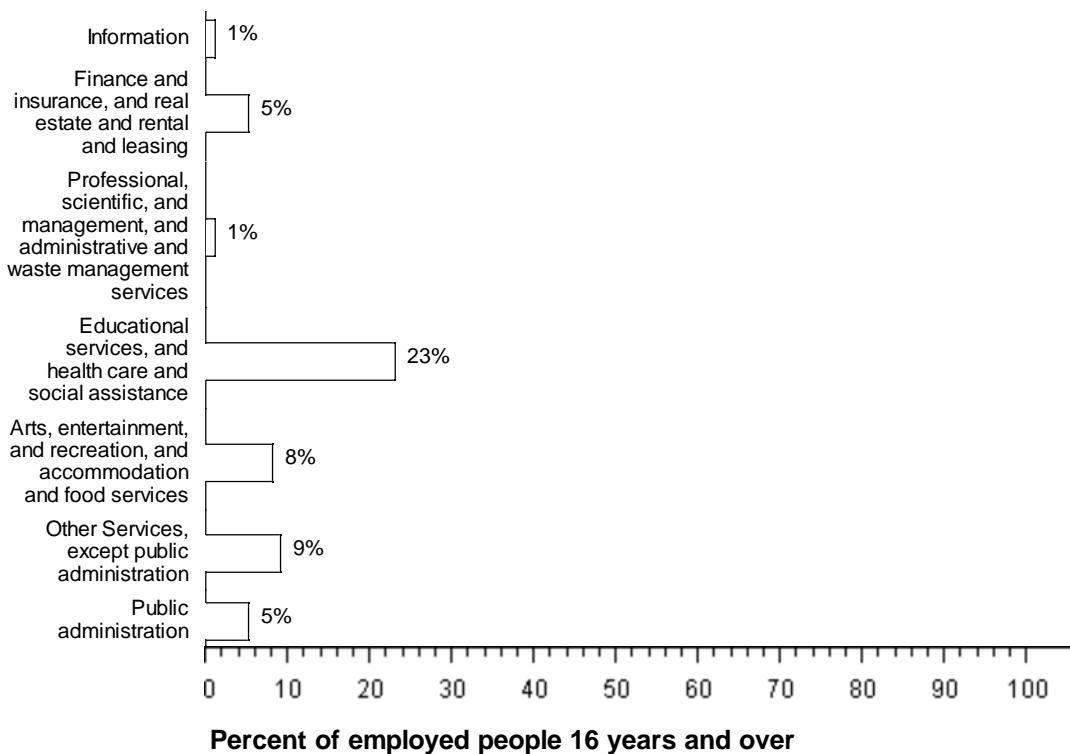

**DISABILITY:** In East Randolph village, among people at least five years old in 2005-2009, percent reported a disability. The likelihood of having a disability varied by age - from percent of people 5 to 15 years old, to percent of people 16 to 64 years old, and to percent of those 65 and older.

**INDUSTRIES:** In 2005-2009, for the employed population 16 years and older, the leading industries in East Randolph village were Educational services, and health care, and social assistance, 23 percent, and Manufacturing, 20 percent.

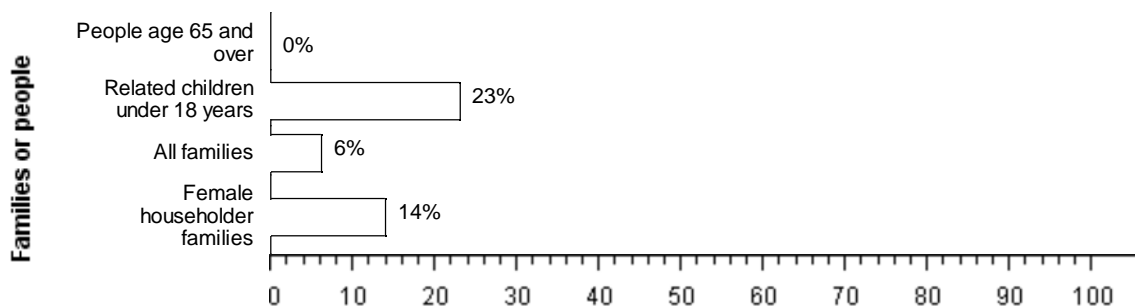
**OCCUPATIONS AND TYPE OF EMPLOYER:** Among the most common occupations were: Management, professional, and related occupations, 30 percent; Sales and office occupations, 20 percent; Service occupations, 19 percent; Production, transportation, and material moving occupations, 14 percent; and Construction, extraction, maintenance, and repair occupations, 12 percent. Sixty-four percent of the people employed were Private wage and salary workers; 24 percent was Federal, state, or local government workers; and 12 percent was Self-employed in own not incorporated business workers.

**TRAVEL TO WORK:** Eighty-two percent of East Randolph village workers drove to work alone in 2005-2009, 11 percent carpooled, less than 0.5 percent took public transportation, and 3 percent used other means. The remaining 4 percent worked at home. Among those who commuted to work, it took them on average 20.2 minutes to get to work.

**INCOME:** The median income of households in East Randolph village was \$47,232. Eighty-eight percent of the households received earnings and 18 percent received retirement income other than Social Security. Twenty-five percent of the households received Social Security. The average income from Social Security was \$16,819. These income sources are not mutually exclusive; that is, some households received income from more than one source.

**POVERTY AND PARTICIPATION IN GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS:** In 2005-2009, 14 percent of people were in poverty. Twenty-three percent of related children under 18 were below the poverty level, compared with less than 0.5 percent of people 65 years old and over. Six percent of all families and 14 percent of families with a female householder and no husband present had incomes below the poverty level.

**Poverty Rates in East Randolph village, New York in 2005-2009**

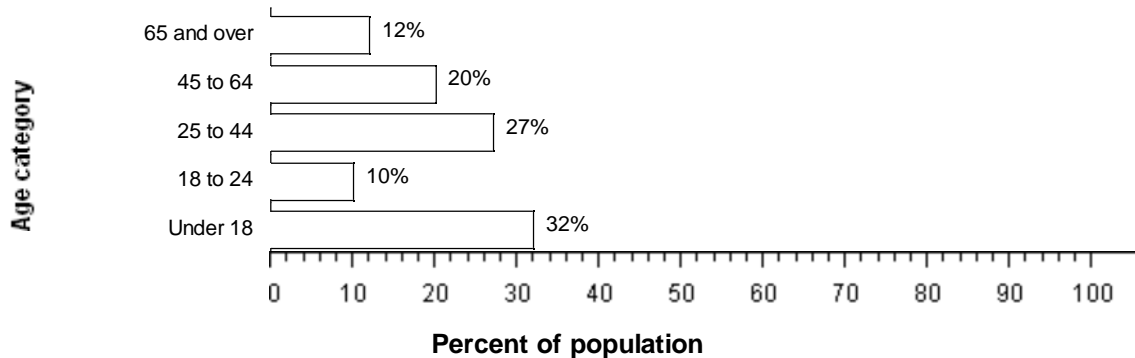


**Percent below poverty level**

POPULATION OF East Randolph village: In 2005-2009, East Randolph village had a total population of 540 - 260 (47 percent) females and 290 (53 percent) males. The median age was 29.8 years. Thirty-two percent of the population was under 18 years and 12 percent was 65 years and older.

**The Age Distribution of People in East Randolph village, New York in 2005-2009**

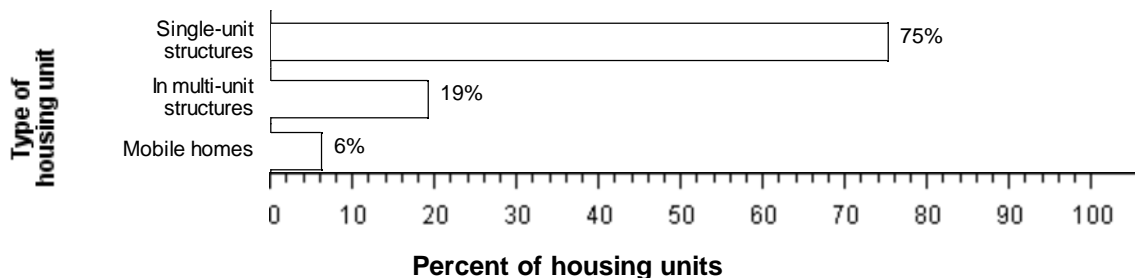

For people reporting one race alone, 91 percent was White; 1 percent was Black or African American; 2 percent was American Indian and Alaska Native; less than 0.5 percent was Asian; less than 0.5 percent was Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, and less than 0.5 percent was Some other race. Six percent reported Two or more races. Two percent of the people in East Randolph village was Hispanic. Ninety percent of the people in East Randolph village was White non-Hispanic. People of Hispanic origin may be of any race.

HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS: In 2005-2009, East Randolph village had a total of 220 housing units, 12 percent of which were vacant. Of the total housing units, 75 percent was in single-unit structures, 19 percent was in multi-unit structures, and 6 percent was mobile homes. Two percent of the housing units were built since 1990.

**The Types of Housing Units in East Randolph village, New York in 2005-2009**

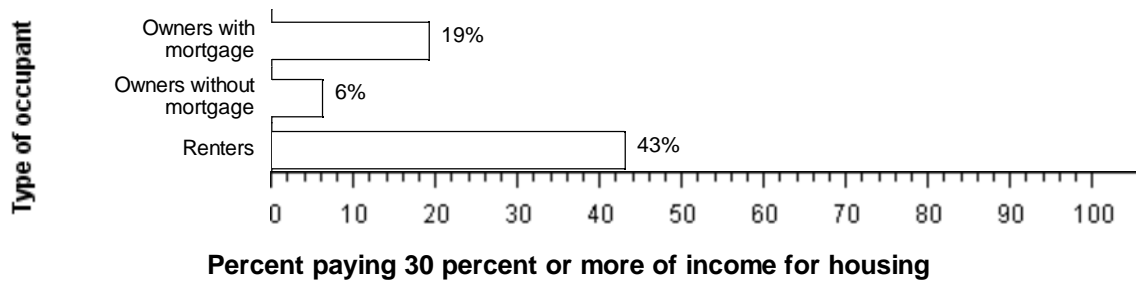

OCCUPIED HOUSING UNIT CHARACTERISTICS: In 2005-2009, East Randolph village had 200 occupied housing units - 150 (78 percent) owner occupied and 42 (22 percent) renter occupied. One percent of the households did not have telephone service and 3 percent of the households did not have access to a car, truck, or van for private use. Multi Vehicle households were not rare. Fifty-five percent had two vehicles and another 16 percent had three or more.

HOUSING COSTS: The median monthly housing costs for mortgaged owners was \$1,058, nonmortgaged owners \$518, and renters \$550. Nineteen percent of owners with mortgages, 6 percent of owners without mortgages, and 43 percent of renters in East Randolph village spent 30 percent or more of household income on housing.
