

NOTE. HOUSEHOLDS AND FAMILIES: In 2005-2009 there were 260 households in Ellicottville village. The average household size was 1.8 people.

Families made up 39 percent of the households in Ellicottville village. This figure includes both married-couple families (37 percent) and other families (2 percent). Nonfamily households made up 61 percent of all households in Ellicottville village. Most of the nonfamily households were people living alone, but some were composed of people living in households in which no one was related to the householder.



The Types of Households in Ellicottville village, New York in 2005-2009



NATIVITY AND LANGUAGE: Twelve percent of the people living in Ellicottville village in 2005-2009 were foreign born. Eighty-eight percent was native, including 68 percent who were born in New York.

Among people at least five years old living in Ellicottville village in 2005-2009, 7 percent spoke a language other than English at home. Of those speaking a language other than English at home, 39 percent spoke Spanish and 61 percent spoke some other language; 29 percent reported that they did not speak English "very well."

GEOGRAPHIC MOBILITY: In 2005-2009, 93 percent of the people at least one year old living in Ellicottville village were living in the same residence one year earlier; 4 percent had moved during the past year from another residence in the same county, 3 percent from another county in the same state, less than 0.5 percent from another state, and less than 0.5 percent from abroad.


Geographic Mobility of Residents of Ellicottville village, New York in 2005-2009

EDUCATION: In 2005-2009, 97 percent of people 25 years and over had at least graduated from high school and 36 percent had a bachelor's degree or higher. Three percent were dropouts; they were not enrolled in school and had not graduated from high school.

The total school enrollment in Ellicottville village was 74 in 2005-2009. Nursery school and kindergarten enrollment was 5 and elementary or high school enrollment was 53 children. College or graduate school enrollment was 16.




The Educational Attainment of People in Ellicottville village, New York in 2005-2009



DISABILITY: In Ellicottville village, among people at least five years old in 2005-2009, percent reported a disability. The likelihood of having a disability varied by age - from percent of people 5 to 15 years old, to percent of people 16 to 64 years old, and to percent of those 65 and older.

INDUSTRIES: In 2005-2009, for the employed population 16 years and older, the leading industries in Ellicottville village were Arts, entertainment, and recreation, and accommodation and food services, 35 percent, and Public administration, 14 percent.


OCCUPATIONS AND TYPE OF EMPLOYER: Among the most common occupations were: Management, professional, and related occupations, 35 percent; Service occupations, 24 percent; Sales and office occupations, 22 percent; Production, transportation, and material moving occupations, 13 percent; and Construction, extraction, maintenance, and repair occupations, 6 percent. Sixty-four percent of the people employed were Private wage and salary workers; 29 percent was Federal, state, or local government workers; and 7 percent was Self-employed in own not incorporated business workers.

TRAVEL TO WORK: Sixty-one percent of Ellicottville village workers drove to work alone in 2005-2009, 7 percent carpooled, less than 0.5 percent took public transportation, and 27 percent used other means. The remaining 5 percent worked at home. Among those who commuted to work, it took them on average 22.6 minutes to get to work.

INCOME: The median income of households in Ellicottville village was \$44,219. Eighty-five percent of the households received earnings and 20 percent received retirement income other than Social Security. Thirty-four percent of the households received Social Security. The average income from Social Security was \$14,146. These income sources are not mutually exclusive; that is, some households received income from more than one source.

POVERTY AND PARTICIPATION IN GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS: In 2005-2009, 2 percent of people were in poverty. Less than 0.5 percent of related children under 18 were below the poverty level, compared with 5 percent of people 65 years old and over. Less than 0.5 percent of all families and less than 0.5 percent of families with a female householder and no husband present had incomes below the poverty level.


Poverty Rates in Ellicottville village, New York in 2005-2009

POPULATION OF Ellicottville village: In 2005-2009, Ellicottville village had a total population of 470 - 240 (51 percent) females and 230 (49 percent) males. The median age was 48.3 years. Thirteen percent of the population was under 18 years and 20 percent was 65 years and older.

The Age Distribution of People in Ellicottville village, New York in 2005-2009



For people reporting one race alone, 100 percent was White; less than 0.5 percent was Black or African American; less than 0.5 percent was American Indian and Alaska Native; less than 0.5 percent was Asian; less than 0.5 percent was Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, and less than 0.5 percent was Some other race. Less than 0.5 percent reported Two or more races. Less than 0.5 percent of the people in Ellicottville village was Hispanic. One hundred percent of the people in Ellicottville village was White non-Hispanic. People of Hispanic origin may be of any race.

HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS: In 2005-2009, Ellicottville village had a total of 600 housing units, 57 percent of which were vacant. Of the total housing units, 65 percent was in single-unit structures, 26 percent was in multi-unit structures, and 9 percent was mobile homes. Nine percent of the housing units were built since 1990.





OCCUPIED HOUSING UNIT CHARACTERISTICS: In 2005-2009, Ellicottville village had 260 occupied housing units - 170 (64 percent) owner occupied and 92 (36 percent) renter occupied. Eight percent of the households did not have telephone service and 8 percent of the households did not have access to a car, truck, or van for private use. Thirty-five percent had two vehicles and another 11 percent had three or more.

HOUSING COSTS: The median monthly housing costs for mortgaged owners was \$1,482, nonmortgaged owners \$665, and renters \$578. Thirty-four percent of owners with mortgages, 28 percent of owners without mortgages, and 44 percent of renters in Ellicottville village spent 30 percent or more of household income on housing.
