

NOTE. HOUSEHOLDS AND FAMILIES: In 2005-2009 there were 320 households in Otto town. The average household size was 2.4 people.

Families made up 72 percent of the households in Otto town. This figure includes both marriedcouple families (58 percent) and other families (13 percent). Nonfamily households made up 28 percent of all households in Otto town. Most of the nonfamily households were people living alone, but some were composed of people living in households in which no one was related to the householder.

NATIVITY AND LANGUAGE: Two percent of the people living in Otto town in 2005-2009 were foreign born. Ninety-eight percent was native, including 79 percent who were born in New York.

Among people at least five years old living in Otto town in 2005-2009, 3 percent spoke a language other than English at home. Of those speaking a language other than English at home, 87 percent spoke Spanish and 13 percent spoke some other language; 17 percent reported that they did not speak English "very well."

GEOGRAPHIC MOBILITY: In 2005-2009, 94 percent of the people at least one year old living in Otto town were living in the same residence one year earlier; 2 percent had moved during the past year from another residence in the same county, 4 percent from another county in the same state, less than 0.5 percent from another state, and 1 percent from abroad.


Geographic Mobility of Residents of Otto town, Cattaraugus County, New York in 2005-2009

EDUCATION: In 2005-2009, 89 percent of people 25 years and over had at least graduated from high school and 13 percent had a bachelor's degree or higher. Eleven percent were dropouts; they were not enrolled in school and had not graduated from high school.

The total school enrollment in Otto town was 190 in 2005-2009. Nursery school and kindergarten enrollment was 11 and elementary or high school enrollment was 130 children. College or graduate school enrollment was 45.




The Educational Attainment of People in Otto town, Cattaraugus County, New York in 2005-2009



DISABILITY: In Otto town, among people at least five years old in 2005-2009, percent reported a disability. The likelihood of having a disability varied by age - from percent of people 5 to 15 years old, to percent of people 16 to 64 years old, and to percent of those 65 and older.

INDUSTRIES: In 2005-2009, for the employed population 16 years and older, the leading industries in Otto town were Construction, 18 percent, and Manufacturing, 16 percent.

Employment by Industry in Otto town, Cattaraugus County, New York in 2005-2009






OCCUPATIONS AND TYPE OF EMPLOYER: Among the most common occupations were: Production, transportation, and material moving occupations, 26 percent; Management, professional, and related occupations, 25 percent; Sales and office occupations, 18 percent; Construction, extraction, maintenance, and repair occupations, 18 percent; and Service occupations, 10 percent. Seventy-three percent of the people employed were Private wage and salary workers; 20 percent was Federal, state, or local government workers; and 7 percent was Self-employed in own not incorporated business workers.

TRAVEL TO WORK: Eighty-nine percent of Otto town workers drove to work alone in 2005-2009, 7 percent carpooled, less than 0.5 percent took public transportation, and less than 0.5 percent used other means. The remaining 4 percent worked at home. Among those who commuted to work, it took them on average 35.7 minutes to get to work.

INCOME: The median income of households in Otto town was \$54,688. Seventy-nine percent of the households received earnings and 28 percent received retirement income other than Social Security. Twenty-eight percent of the households received Social Security. The average income from Social Security was \$15,292. These income sources are not mutually exclusive; that is, some households received income from more than one source.


POVERTY AND PARTICIPATION IN GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS: In 2005-2009, 8 percent of people were in poverty. Fifteen percent of related children under 18 were below the poverty level, compared with 11 percent of people 65 years old and over. Six percent of all families and 54 percent of families with a female householder and no husband present had incomes below the poverty level.

POPULATION OF Otto town: In 2005-2009, Otto town had a total population of 770 - 380 (49 percent) females and 390 (51 percent) males. The median age was 47 years. Twenty-three percent of the population was under 18 years and 12 percent was 65 years and older.


The Age Distribution of People in Otto town, Cattaraugus County, New York in 2005-2009

For people reporting one race alone, 99 percent was White; less than 0.5 percent was Black or African American; less than 0.5 percent was American Indian and Alaska Native; less than 0.5 percent was Asian; less than 0.5 percent was Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, and 1 percent was Some other race. Less than 0.5 percent reported Two or more races. One percent of the people in Otto town was Hispanic. Ninety-nine percent of the people in Otto town was White non-Hispanic. People of Hispanic origin may be of any race.

HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS: In 2005-2009, Otto town had a total of 420 housing units, 24 percent of which were vacant. Of the total housing units, 84 percent was in single-unit structures, less than 0.5 percent was in multi-unit structures, and 16 percent was mobile homes. Twenty-six percent of the housing units were built since 1990.




The Types of Housing Units in Otto town, Cattaraugus County, New York in 2005-2009

OCCUPIED HOUSING UNIT CHARACTERISTICS: In 2005-2009, Otto town had 320 occupied housing units - 280 (87 percent) owner occupied and 40 (13 percent) renter occupied. One percent of the households did not have telephone service and 8 percent of the households did not have access to a car, truck, or van for private use. Multi Vehicle households were not rare. Forty-one percent had two vehicles and another 26 percent had three or more.

HOUSING COSTS: The median monthly housing costs for mortgaged owners was \$1,275, nonmortgaged owners \$412, and renters \$396. Thirty-four percent of owners with mortgages, 10 percent of owners without mortgages, and 45 percent of renters in Otto town spent 30 percent or more of household income on housing.
