

NOTE. HOUSEHOLDS AND FAMILIES: In 2005-2009 there were 1,000 households in Persia town. The average household size was 2.4 people.

Families made up 71 percent of the households in Persia town. This figure includes both marriedcouple families (51 percent) and other families (20 percent). Nonfamily households made up 29 percent of all households in Persia town. Most of the nonfamily households were people living alone, but some were composed of people living in households in which no one was related to the householder.

NATIVITY AND LANGUAGE: Less than 0.5 percent of the people living in Persia town in 2005-2009 were foreign born. One hundred percent was native, including 82 percent who were born in New York.

Among people at least five years old living in Persia town in 2005-2009, 3 percent spoke a language other than English at home. Of those speaking a language other than English at home, 66 percent spoke Spanish and 34 percent spoke some other language; less than 0.5 percent reported that they did not speak English "very well."

GEOGRAPHIC MOBILITY: In 2005-2009, 85 percent of the people at least one year old living in Persia town were living in the same residence one year earlier; 8 percent had moved during the past year from another residence in the same county, 6 percent from another county in the same state, less than 0.5 percent from another state, and 1 percent from abroad.



EDUCATION: In 2005-2009, 86 percent of people 25 years and over had at least graduated from high school and 21 percent had a bachelor's degree or higher. Fourteen percent were dropouts; they were not enrolled in school and had not graduated from high school.

The total school enrollment in Persia town was 540 in 2005-2009. Nursery school and kindergarten enrollment was 43 and elementary or high school enrollment was 440 children. College or graduate school enrollment was 52.




The Educational Attainment of People in Persia town, Cattaraugus County, New York in 2005-2009



DISABILITY: In Persia town, among people at least five years old in 2005-2009, percent reported a disability. The likelihood of having a disability varied by age - from percent of people 5 to 15 years old, to percent of people 16 to 64 years old, and to percent of those 65 and older.

INDUSTRIES: In 2005-2009, for the employed population 16 years and older, the leading industries in Persia town were Educational services, and health care, and social assistance, 40 percent, and Manufacturing, 9 percent.

Employment by Industry in Persia town, Cattaraugus County, New York in 2005-2009






OCCUPATIONS AND TYPE OF EMPLOYER: Among the most common occupations were: Service occupations, 31 percent; Management, professional, and related occupations, 29 percent; Sales and office occupations, 15 percent; Construction, extraction, maintenance, and repair occupations, 13 percent; and Production, transportation, and material moving occupations, 9 percent. Sixty-five percent of the people employed were Private wage and salary workers; 31 percent was Federal, state, or local government workers; and 4 percent was Self-employed in own not incorporated business workers.

TRAVEL TO WORK: Seventy-two percent of Persia town workers drove to work alone in 2005-2009, 9 percent carpooled, 1 percent took public transportation, and 12 percent used other means. The remaining 5 percent worked at home. Among those who commuted to work, it took them on average 22.5 minutes to get to work.

INCOME: The median income of households in Persia town was \$44,242. Seventy-eight percent of the households received earnings and 26 percent received retirement income other than Social Security. Twenty-nine percent of the households received Social Security. The average income from Social Security was \$16,840. These income sources are not mutually exclusive; that is, some households received income from more than one source.


POVERTY AND PARTICIPATION IN GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS: In 2005-2009, 15 percent of people were in poverty. Eighteen percent of related children under 18 were below the poverty level, compared with 14 percent of people 65 years old and over. Ten percent of all families and 35 percent of families with a female householder and no husband present had incomes below the poverty level.

POPULATION OF Persia town: In 2005-2009, Persia town had a total population of 2,600 - 1,400 (53 percent) females and 1,200 (47 percent) males. The median age was 43.7 years. Twenty-one percent of the population was under 18 years and 15 percent was 65 years and older.


The Age Distribution of People in Persia town, Cattaraugus County, New York in 2005-2009

For people reporting one race alone, 93 percent was White; 1 percent was Black or African American; 2 percent was American Indian and Alaska Native; less than 0.5 percent was Asian; less than 0.5 percent was Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, and less than 0.5 percent was Some other race. Four percent reported Two or more races. One percent of the people in Persia town was Hispanic. Ninety-three percent of the people in Persia town was White non-Hispanic. People of Hispanic origin may be of any race.

HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS: In 2005-2009, Persia town had a total of 1,000 housing units, 3 percent of which were vacant. Of the total housing units, 80 percent was in single-unit structures, 17 percent was in multi-unit structures, and 2 percent was mobile homes. Five percent of the housing units were built since 1990.




The Types of Housing Units in Persia town, Cattaraugus County, New York in 2005-2009

OCCUPIED HOUSING UNIT CHARACTERISTICS: In 2005-2009, Persia town had 1,000 occupied housing units - 770 (77 percent) owner occupied and 230 (23 percent) renter occupied. Four percent of the households did not have telephone service and 3 percent of the households did not have access to a car, truck, or van for private use. Multi Vehicle households were not rare. Forty-nine percent had two vehicles and another 11 percent had three or more.

HOUSING COSTS: The median monthly housing costs for mortgaged owners was \$1,034, nonmortgaged owners \$447, and renters \$586. Thirty-four percent of owners with mortgages, 9 percent of owners without mortgages, and 40 percent of renters in Persia town spent 30 percent or more of household income on housing.
