

NOTE. HOUSEHOLDS AND FAMILIES: In 2005-2009 there were 12 households in Red House town. The average household size was 1.9 people.

Families made up 83 percent of the households in Red House town. This figure includes both married-couple families (75 percent) and other families (8 percent). Nonfamily households made up 17 percent of all households in Red House town. Most of the nonfamily households were people living alone, but some were composed of people living in households in which no one was related to the householder.



The Types of Households in Red House town, Cattaraugus County, New York in 2005-2009



NATIVITY AND LANGUAGE: Less than 0.5 percent of the people living in Red House town in 2005-2009 were foreign born. One hundred percent was native, including 100 percent who were born in New York.

Among people at least five years old living in Red House town in 2005-2009, 9 percent spoke a language other than English at home. Of those speaking a language other than English at home, less than 0.5 percent spoke Spanish and 100 percent spoke some other language; 100 percent reported that they did not speak English "very well."

GEOGRAPHIC MOBILITY: In 2005-2009, 96 percent of the people at least one year old living in Red House town were living in the same residence one year earlier; less than 0.5 percent had moved during the past year from another residence in the same county, 4 percent from another county in the same state, less than 0.5 percent from another state, and less than 0.5 percent from abroad.


Geographic Mobility of Residents of Red House town, Cattaraugus County, New York in 2005-2009



EDUCATION: In 2005-2009, 100 percent of people 25 years and over had at least graduated from high school and 19 percent had a bachelor's degree or higher. Less than 0.5 percent were dropouts; they were not enrolled in school and had not graduated from high school.

The total school enrollment in Red House town was 3 in 2005-2009. Nursery school and kindergarten enrollment was 1 and elementary or high school enrollment was less than 0.5 children. College or graduate school enrollment was 2.






Percent of people 25 years and over



DISABILITY: In Red House town, among people at least five years old in 2005-2009, percent reported a disability. The likelihood of having a disability varied by age - from percent of people 5 to 15 years old, to percent of people 16 to 64 years old, and to percent of those 65 and older.

INDUSTRIES: In 2005-2009, for the employed population 16 years and older, the leading industries in Red House town were Arts, entertainment, and recreation, and accommodation and food services, 53 percent, and Educational services, and health care, and social assistance, 24 percent.

OCCUPATIONS AND TYPE OF EMPLOYER: Among the most common occupations were: Management, professional, and related occupations, 41 percent; Sales and office occupations, 29 percent; Production, transportation, and material moving occupations, 24 percent; Construction, extraction, maintenance, and repair occupations, 6 percent; and Service occupations, less than 0.5 percent. Twenty-nine percent of the people employed were Private wage and salary workers; 71 percent was Federal, state, or local government workers; and less than 0.5 percent was Self-employed in own not incorporated business workers.


TRAVEL TO WORK: Seventy-five percent of Red House town workers drove to work alone in 2005-2009, less than 0.5 percent carpooled, less than 0.5 percent took public transportation, and 25 percent used other means. The remaining less than 0.5 percent worked at home. Among those who commuted to work, it took them on average 14.7 minutes to get to work.

INCOME: The median income of households in Red House town was \$66,875. One hundred percent of the households received earnings and 8 percent received retirement income other than Social Security. Thirty-three percent of the households received Social Security. The average income from Social Security was \$12,900. These income sources are not mutually exclusive; that is, some households received income from more than one source.

POVERTY AND PARTICIPATION IN GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS: Data for this section cannot be displayed because the number of sample cases is too small. Displaying the data would risk disclosing information for individuals.

POPULATION OF Red House town: In 2005-2009, Red House town had a total population of 23 - 10 (43 percent) females and 13 (57 percent) males. The median age was 52.5 years. Four percent of the population was under 18 years and less than 0.5 percent was 65 years and older.

## The Age Distribution of People in Red House town, Cattaraugus County, New York in 2005-2009





For people reporting one race alone, 100 percent was White; less than 0.5 percent was Black or African American; less than 0.5 percent was American Indian and Alaska Native; less than 0.5 percent was Asian; less than 0.5 percent was Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, and less than 0.5 percent was Some other race. Less than 0.5 percent reported Two or more races. Less than 0.5 percent of the people in Red House town was Hispanic. One hundred percent of the people in Red House town was White non-Hispanic. People of Hispanic origin may be of any race.

HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS: In 2005-2009, Red House town had a total of 12 housing units, less than 0.5 percent of which were vacant. Of the total housing units, 83 percent was in single-unit structures, 17 percent was in multi-unit structures, and less than 0.5 percent was mobile homes. Less than 0.5 percent of the housing units were built since 1990.

OCCUPIED HOUSING UNIT CHARACTERISTICS: In 2005-2009, Red House town had 12 occupied housing units - 7 (58 percent) owner occupied and 5 (42 percent) renter occupied. Less than 0.5 percent of the households did not have telephone service and less than 0.5 percent of the households did not have telephone service use. Multi Vehicle households were not rare. Fifty percent had two vehicles and another 25 percent had three or more.
