

**HOUSEHOLDS AND FAMILIES:** In 2005-2009 there were 240 households in South Dayton village. The average household size was 2.9 people.

Families made up 78 percent of the households in South Dayton village. This figure includes both married-couple families (48 percent) and other families (30 percent). Nonfamily households made up 22 percent of all households in South Dayton village. Most of the nonfamily households were people living alone, but some were composed of people living in households in which no one was related to the householder.

**The Types of Households in South Dayton village, New York in 2005-2009**





**NATIVITY AND LANGUAGE:** Less than 0.5 percent of the people living in South Dayton village in 2005-2009 were foreign born. One hundred percent was native, including 81 percent who were born in New York.

Among people at least five years old living in South Dayton village in 2005-2009, 2 percent spoke a language other than English at home. Of those speaking a language other than English at home, 75 percent spoke Spanish and 25 percent spoke some other language; less than 0.5 percent reported that they did not speak English "very well."

**GEOGRAPHIC MOBILITY:** In 2005-2009, 91 percent of the people at least one year old living in South Dayton village were living in the same residence one year earlier; 5 percent had moved during the past year from another residence in the same county, 3 percent from another county in the same state, 1 percent from another state, and less than 0.5 percent from abroad.

### Geographic Mobility of Residents of South Dayton village, New York in 2005-2009



**EDUCATION:** In 2005-2009, 88 percent of people 25 years and over had at least graduated from high school and 12 percent had a bachelor's degree or higher. Twelve percent were dropouts; they were not enrolled in school and had not graduated from high school.

The total school enrollment in South Dayton village was 210 in 2005-2009. Nursery school and kindergarten enrollment was 38 and elementary or high school enrollment was 170 children. College or graduate school enrollment was 8.

**The Educational Attainment of People in South Dayton village, New York in 2005-2009**






**DISABILITY:** In South Dayton village, among people at least five years old in 2005-2009, percent reported a disability. The likelihood of having a disability varied by age - from percent of people 5 to 15 years old, to percent of people 16 to 64 years old, and to percent of those 65 and older.

**INDUSTRIES:** In 2005-2009, for the employed population 16 years and older, the leading industries in South Dayton village were Educational services, and health care, and social assistance, 25 percent, and Manufacturing, 19 percent.


**OCCUPATIONS AND TYPE OF EMPLOYER:** Among the most common occupations were: Sales and office occupations, 34 percent; Service occupations, 24 percent; Production, transportation, and material moving occupations, 19 percent; Management, professional, and related occupations, 13 percent; and Construction, extraction, maintenance, and repair occupations, 11 percent. Seventy percent of the people employed were Private wage and salary workers; 28 percent was Federal, state, or local government workers; and 1 percent was Self-employed in own not incorporated business workers.

**TRAVEL TO WORK:** Seventy-eight percent of South Dayton village workers drove to work alone in 2005-2009, 15 percent carpooled, less than 0.5 percent took public transportation, and 7 percent used other means. The remaining less than 0.5 percent worked at home. Among those who commuted to work, it took them on average 25.4 minutes to get to work.

**INCOME:** The median income of households in South Dayton village was \$43,542. Eighty percent of the households received earnings and 19 percent received retirement income other than Social Security. Twenty-nine percent of the households received Social Security. The average income from Social Security was \$15,662. These income sources are not mutually exclusive; that is, some households received income from more than one source.

**POVERTY AND PARTICIPATION IN GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS:** In 2005-2009, 6 percent of people were in poverty. Five percent of related children under 18 were below the poverty level, compared with 4 percent of people 65 years old and over. Six percent of all families and 19 percent of families with a female householder and no husband present had incomes below the poverty level.


**Poverty Rates in South Dayton village, New York in 2005-2009**

POPULATION OF South Dayton village: In 2005-2009, South Dayton village had a total population of 680 - 370 (54 percent) females and 310 (46 percent) males. The median age was 30.3 years. Thirty-eight percent of the population was under 18 years and 11 percent was 65 years and older.

**The Age Distribution of People in South Dayton village, New York in 2005-2009**



For people reporting one race alone, 98 percent was White; less than 0.5 percent was Black or African American; less than 0.5 percent was American Indian and Alaska Native; less than 0.5 percent was Asian; less than 0.5 percent was Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, and less than 0.5 percent was Some other race. Two percent reported Two or more races. Less than 0.5 percent of the people in South Dayton village was Hispanic. Ninety-eight percent of the people in South Dayton village was White non-Hispanic. People of Hispanic origin may be of any race.

HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS: In 2005-2009, South Dayton village had a total of 300 housing units, 19 percent of which were vacant. Of the total housing units, 78 percent was in single-unit structures, 17 percent was in multi-unit structures, and 6 percent was mobile homes. Three percent of the housing units were built since 1990.

**The Types of Housing Units in South Dayton village, New York in 2005-2009**



OCCUPIED HOUSING UNIT CHARACTERISTICS: In 2005-2009, South Dayton village had 240 occupied housing units - 170 (72 percent) owner occupied and 68 (28 percent) renter occupied. Five percent of the households did not have telephone service and 13 percent of the households did not have access to a car, truck, or van for private use. Multi Vehicle households were not rare. Forty-one percent had two vehicles and another 13 percent had three or more.

HOUSING COSTS: The median monthly housing costs for mortgaged owners was \$967, nonmortgaged owners \$441, and renters \$614. Twelve percent of owners with mortgages, 10 percent of owners without mortgages, and 45 percent of renters in South Dayton village spent 30 percent or more of household income on housing.
